## AN ORDER OF WORSHIP FOR EVENING (Advent)

Officiant: Our King and Savior now draws near:

People: Come let us adore him.

Advent 1: See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called

children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. [1 John 3:

1-2]

Advent 2: You who are the hope of Israel, its Savior in times of distress, why are you

like a stranger in the land, like a traveler who stays only a night? Why are you like a man taken by surprise, like a warrior powerless to save? You are among us, Lord, and we bear your name; do not forsake us! [Jeremiah 14:8-9]

Advent 3: "I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then

suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the Lord Almighty. But who can endure the day of his coming? Who can stand when he appears? For he

will be like a refiner's fire or a launderer's soap. [Malachi 3:1-2]

Advent 4: For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on

his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. [Isaiah 9:6]

O Gracious Light ~ Phos hilaron

O gracious light, pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed! Now as we come to the setting of the sun, and our eyes behold the vesper light, we sing your praises, O God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. You are worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices, O Son of God, O Giver of Life, and to be glorified through all the worlds.

The candles are now lighted.

The hymn is sung. (See other side)

The officiant takes a glass of wine and says:

Blessed are you, O King of the universe, for you have given us the fruit of the vine to make us joyful!

The officiant takes the bread and prays:


Blessed are you, O King of the universe! You have given us bread from the earth.


The bread is broken and shared around the table. The officiant reads the concluding prayer


